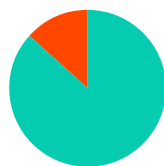

...ACADEMIC OUTCOMES OF CHOICE PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS

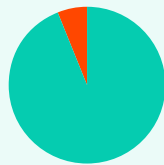

Example: In Milwaukee, a parental choice program led to 10.7% higher scores in math and 5.8% higher performance in reading than public school peers.

...ACADEMIC OUTCOMES FOR STUDENTS REMAINING IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

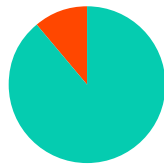

Example: In Florida, low-performing public schools saw a 15% improvement in math after school choice was enacted.

...FISCAL IMPACT ON TAXPAYERS, PUBLIC SCHOOLS

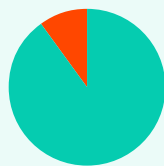

Example: Florida's school choice program saved the state \$57.9 million for 2012-2013. In Oklahoma, \$1.24 was saved for every \$1 in tax credits. Individual districts can save on the variable expenses of educating prior students, while keeping federal and local dollars.

...RACIAL COMPOSITION OF PUBLIC SCHOOLS

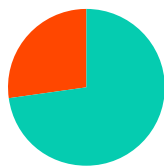
